On October 7th of this year I had the tremendous joy of attending MCM's very first graduation ceremony! The significance of the accomplishments of our first six graduates hit me hard as I first saw them lined up at the top of our hill in their caps and gowns. The music began and Ivan, the Executive Director for MCM, called them forward amid loud cheers and "congs" and happy laughter. Dancing all the way down to their seats of honor they split the sea of 500 children sitting on the steps, in the driveway and all over our property. Goosebumps rose as I realized the life changing miracle and gravity of this event. Four of these young people were orphans and two had parents that were peasant farmers, unable to afford tuition fees. To move from having no parents, no school funds, and no hope for the future to completing Secondary school then Vocational school and even University...well, as each graduate shared... this was only possible from the heart of our amazing, faithful, good Father in heaven.

I too feel as though I have undergone a graduate level education these past 6 years with MCM. I have earned "degrees" in misunderstanding cultural differences, misjudging people and situations, making assumptions and unreasonable demands, taking things personally, and being ridiculously arrogant among other mistakes. I have struggled to pass "tests" in perseverance, patience, politeness, humility, graciousness, giving, gratitude, friendship, kindness, forgiveness and asking to be forgiven. I find myself ever re-writing my "dissertation" on God's Love because it is so beyond comprehension.

When I had my moment to speak to the graduates I chose to speak about "Unknowing" from a devotional written by Fr Richard Rohr. I encouraged them to stay curious and humble in life and in searching for God. To not presume they knew fully but to be more concerned with loving behavior. To embrace the mystery of our unfathomable God, agreeing to live without resolution. If we must know, let us know God loves us. If we must be certain, let us be certain of His Love even when we are weak and fail. In this school of Love I never cease learning and I hope never to graduate.

Thank you all from the bottom of our hearts for your faithful giving and generosity and the roles you have played in making MCM possible! God bless you with the joy of participating in miracles with Him. May your Christmas be full of Love and Peace!

In August MCM hosted our first two day seminar given by three Social Workers. In October our sponsor, Stella Zaimi, also visited our village. During that time we had a fabulous Graduation Ceremony for our first MCM graduates. And finally, our Guest House, "God's Refuge", although incomplete, is up and running and housed most of our visitors.

MCM - Uganda had the wonderful privilege of hosting Patti Johnson and Stella Zaimi. Each woman spent two weeks with us in our village. I was particularly encouraged that they would make the additional sacrifice of time and money to come visit us. I know each gives their resources and time for MCM but I never imagined their willingness to sacrifice more in traveling to Uganda. We

had a great time showing them our beautiful country and introducing both to our children and our village. Not only have Patti and Stella blessed MCM from afar but both were gifts to us while here. Its been weeks since they left but

She taught them they have a purpose and are protected and loved with examples from Moses' life. Patti also delighted the children by preparing in advance a fun craft project and





leading singing too. During her stay, Patti showered the children with love in tangible ways as she visited them in our home, in villager's homes, at schools, in town and even at hospitals. In October Stella visited because her sponsored "son" was graduating from University. At the party the advice Stella gave the children was what they needed to hear at the time, given the situation this side of the world finds itself in. 
Graduation Ceremony

Six of our children successfully completed their basic education and went on to graduate from various avenues of further education. First, Christopher graduated from vocational school for construction and brick laying. Next, Violar and Glorious graduated in Accounting and Record Keeping. In August Caleb and Aron completed the study of Automotive Repair and in October Obed received his University degree in Social Work and Administration.



The graduation party was a very sweet and unforgettable experience! To witness these boys and girls in their caps and gowns parade down the aisle to the applause of their peers and those who view them as role models was inspiring for all, including the many guardians who have done a lot to see

such a day come. This graduation party had several benefits. First, it was wonderful to spend time congratulating the graduates. Second, it was equally wonderful to celebrate with each child's family members who at one time could only have dreamed of such an accomplishment. Lastly, the party served as an encouragement to our younger children. It reminded them of what is possible when they dedicate themselves to their studies. Each graduate spent a few minutes sharing with the audience his or her story of how they reached their goal as well. Every child thanked God especially for helping them in their achievements. Self sustainability has been a high value for MCM from the beginning. In 2019 MCM self sustainability initiatives include an expanded chicken house with separate areas for the egg layers and the chickens sold for meat. We also hope to start goat rearing by building a goat barn and purchasing baby goats. Our pigs have been the most consistent income for MCM so the piggery is being moved to a bigger location as well. All 3 of these can be funded for \$1000 in total.

CHRISTIAN NTEZIMAANA

Christian (15) lost both his parents when he was 6. He now lives with his Aunt and Uncle who have 5 children of their own. They do not earn enough to pay for all the children. Christian suffered a bike accident and lost his left eye a few years ago but still scored well in the national exams. His goal is to be a doctor someday and he is currently in Senior Two (sophomore level).



ELIOT TAREMWA

Eliot (8) is the second oldest in his family of four children. His father is chronically ill and unable to work. His Mum is a manual farm laborer and her low income cannot pay Eliot's school fees. Eliot is a bright child, ranked first out of 48 in his Primary Three class. He wants to become a Pilot.



JOSHUA TAREMWA

Joshua (4) is the only child of his single mother. His father died years ago as a solider. His Mum, Doreen, is a peasant farmer who digs to earn money for tuition. Joshua is in kindergarten and hopes to be a teacher someday. His favorite "subject" in school is "playing"



WITNESS NINSIIMA

Witness (16) is the fifth of eight children and lives with her parents who are peasant farmers and provide manual labor for crops of other people. Witness is a serious student, ranked 45th out of her class of 168 in Senior 3 (junior level). She would love to be a nurse someday.



RONAH NATUMANYA

Ronah (16) is the fourth of seven children (4 brothers and 2 sisters) and was unable to attend school last year due to lack of tuition funds. Rohah's Mum is a peasant farmer who digs for other landowners. Her Dad is a peddler doing whatever he can to help. Ronah wants to be a lawyer and she performs very well in Senior Four (senior level).



INNOCENT TWINOMASIKO

Innocent (16) was brought as a child by his father to his grandmother for care. His mother had abandoned the boy years before. Innocent's grandmother has been digging on farms to support him and his 9 year old cousin but has grown too old to earn enough to support the children's tuition fees. Innocent is in Senior Three (junior level) and has the goal of being a doctor.
