# mountain children's ministry

Mid Year Summary  
June 2021

## DEAR FRIENDS,

I took this photo in 2013 on an early morning walk to the clothesline to hang up our children's freshly washed laundry. They left for school running and laughing down the hill and I was tired. My alarm jolted me up while it was dark and I had to use my flashlight to then wake the kids up. Getting ready in the dark is chaotic and teens can be frustrating, so I was ready to climb back in my warm bed and return to sleep when I discovered all the wet clothes had been left by the door. I carried them out into the cold mountain air feeling sorry for myself. When I rounded the side of the house these double rainbows (photo above) greeted me. God in nature - stops me in my tracks every time. No matter my circumstances, I must stop and marvel and thank God, again!

This is how I am feeling about MCM at this point in history. Rudely blasted out of my comfort zone and finding my way in a dark, chaotic time. I'm tired, frustrated and then delightfully surprised by God - in the end marveling and grateful. As Ivan will share in his update on the following pages MCM has entered a season of trusting God through dark times. In November 2020 our 16 year old Phabi had emergency brain cancer surgery; in January 2021 our 14 year old Bridget was scheduled for surgery to correct severe bilateral arm pain; in February our 17 year old

Imon was diagnosed with an eye disease that will render him blind in a few years and in March our 15 year old Mark had an Echocardiogram which revealed such severe heart damage he needs open heart surgery in May. Villagers are still in need of COVID food support and it has now been 16 months since I have returned to Uganda and my babies.

And yet...not one but two rainbows! Miraculously, donors have been giving generous gifts completely unsolicited and unexpectedly. "God has really blessed us and so we want to bless you!" "God laid you on our hearts." "Our mom died and we would like you to receive donations in her honor." "Kiddos!" "We feel although things are tight, God is encouraging us to give." And more, SERIOUSLY!

God displayed His faithfulness in meeting our financial needs as they arose. He covered thousands of dollars of surgery, chemo, radiation, eye telescopes, Dr fees and truckloads of food through the love of His people! Then, when most of our children returned to school we had enough for tuition, fees, books, uniforms and mattresses. Three children's homes collapsed and God provided funds to rebuild them. Over and over the scary news was met in double rainbows.

We are not out of the woods by a long shot. We are not assured of our children's recoveries; we are very aware of the frightening possibilities. Ivan and I still wonder where future resources will come from. However, God is present in it all. He demonstrates in loving tangible ways He will never leave us nor forsake us. He has painted double rainbows in the sky to remind us He keeps His promises...all we have to do is look up!

May your dark, chaotic, frightening seasons also be blessed by the goodness and love and peace of God in unexpected miraculous ways. Praying alongside all of you, together building each other up. We remain so very grateful for you ALL!

## UPDATES FROM IVAN IN UGANDA: JUNE 2021

Greetings in the name of our Saviour Jesus! I thank God for granting you good health in the midst of a pandemic. My prayer is He keep you healthy all through this challenging time. Once again I wish to write about God's endless faithfulness!

It is almost 9 years now since we felt God calling us to this small village in southwest Uganda. In the past, whenever I would come to visit my heart broke seeing the condition of the villagers and feeling my own inability to help. There was a cycle of poverty caused by both lack of education and alcohol addiction. With little school, people did not have jobs, could not provide for family and escaped that pain with homemade brew. I thought if someone could step in and break the cycle by capturing the young children's hearts for God, educating each and bringing hope, one at a time, some day the whole village could be transformed.

This was our goal when we started MCM; our vehicle - acts of grace. God has been faithful to our prayer! We started with 5 children and now we are ministering to more than 200 young men and women who, in turn, minister to their families and friends creating a multiplier effect. I used to wonder where we would find sponsors to help the many desperate children but I was limiting God. Again He surprised me with His faithfulness. MCM graduates are gainfully employed and we can count 18 plus people who are not returning to the broken lifestyle of their family. What we thought was impossible because we are human, God has made possible.

Just as we were seeing this development, in came the pandemic. COVID was very challenging in terms of loss of food and income. Again God was faithful not only providing resources for food for our children and needy villagers but bringing rain in the dry season so farmers could plant early during COVID lockdown.

Sadly we are now facing our most difficult season of all. God asks us to trust Him with the worst news. In November one of our own dear children, Phabi, got brain cancer. It was discouraging, heartbreaking and scaring. Scaring because when we went to the hospital, they told us we would need in excess of sh.30,000,000 (\$8,400). This kind of money we could only trust God to provide and He did provide! The child is now receiving radiotherapy, then will move to chemotherapy and we pray she will fully recover.

Bridget, 14 years

When we thought we had turned the corner with Phabi, another of our children, Bridget came complaining of her arm joints paining both arms. Bridget had been scheduled for surgery last year but was cancelled due to COVID lockdown. She returned to the doctors and another surgery has been rescheduled for August, a long time to suffer with her pain.





Imon, 17 years

Then in March, Imon, one of our promising teens, got Retinitis Pigmentosa. This rare genetic disease causing breakdown and loss of the cells of the retina has no cure. He can expect to be blind by his 20's and was told to learn Braille now. He was fit with a pair of glasses and a telescopic device to read with. We pray for a miracle for Imon!

Finally, more sad, more scarring news in March - Mark, a teen diagnosed with Rheumatic Heart Disease as a little child, also became very ill (again) and the doctors said he needs surgery urgently to repair his valves. The boy cannot walk ten feet without becoming completely winded and needing rest. This surgery required sh.23,000,000 (\$6,400)! But we serve a good God and He provided for it too. Even before we knew we would need it, God knew! The heart theater is so full so we are waiting for a date for surgery in May.

Without our dear sponsors, these children would have gone. This is why I am amazed at God's faithfulness again. Though we may get troubles such as these, we are convinced that in 20 years time, this village will not be the same as it was because of what God has done through you and through our children. I could go on but the truth is that God has come out for us strong when the future looked bad. He has continued to use you in significant and monumental ways! Thank you!

We can never repay you except in keeping you in our daily prayers. Thank you for also keeping us in your prayers, especially our children! May He continue to bless you and prosper you and above all keep you safe and healthy.

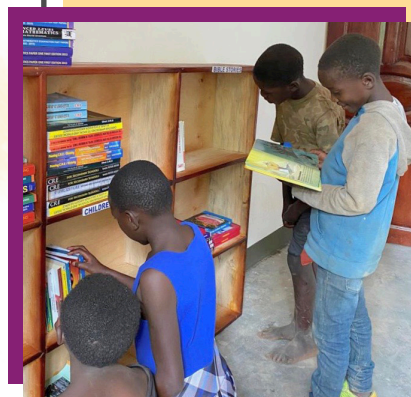
### MCM Medical Emergency Fund

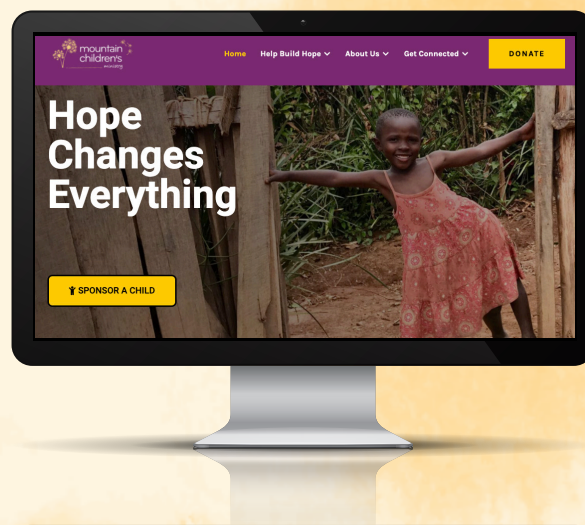
## A NEW MCM WEBSITE

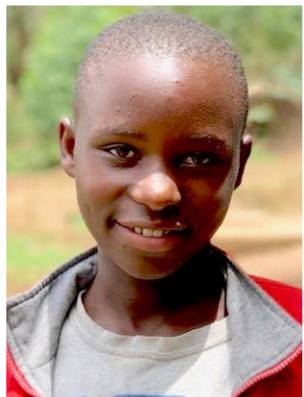
### JACK ARINDA

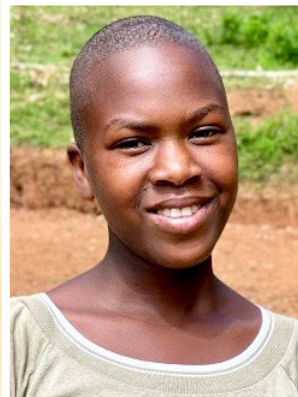
### HONEST NATUMANYA

Charles returned recently and behaves erratically. Honest's mother is also under treatment for mental problems. Honest wants to be a Doctor someday.



### BLESSED BYONANEBYE

Blessed (14) lost her father in 2017 who suffered with severe diabetes for a long time. Her mother, Maureen, digs weeds. Farming is how she earns income for food for her two children but it is not enough to pay the school tuition and fees. Blessed wants to be a Lawyer someday.



### PRINCESS AHABWEMBABAZI

Princess (16) lost her father when she was seven. Soon afterwards Princess' mother left her with her grandmother and never returned due to family hostility. Princess' grandma is a peasant farmer but is growing too old to provide school costs. Princess (16) wants to be a Nurse someday.



### FAITH ATUKUNDA

Faith (11) lives with her parents, both peasant farmers who do not own land themselves. Although they work hard they cannot provide enough for school fees for their three children. Faith wants to be a Lawyer someday.



### SAMUEL TASHOBYA

Samuel (11) has parents who are teachers. Both lost their jobs with COVID when schools were required to lock down. As schools open they continue to look for work but do not have the school fees to return their two children to class. Samuel wants to be an Engineer someday.

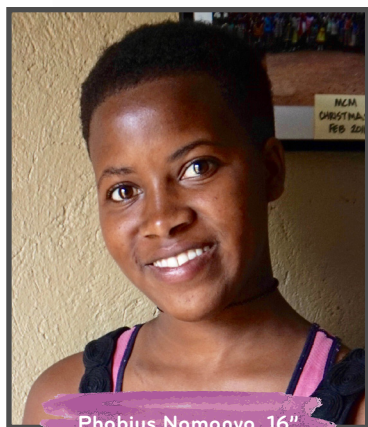

In January of 2014 we were introduced to Phabius, a sweet 11 yr old girl who lost both of her parents at the young age of 5. Her older sister was caring for her but could no longer meet her needs, so Phabius, malnourished and extremely shy, moved into the MCM house. She blossomed physically, mentally, and socially by living in this community.

As a nurse myself, I've had the fun of encouraging

Phabius in her dream to become a nurse. We receive beautiful letters from Phabius, along with her report cards, and updates, which I've saved in a special notebook. Phabius continues to express thankfulness to our family. We feel more blessed by her sweet love and concern for our family, even during this

extremely difficult time in her life - as I will continue to share these most recent events.

In December, we received the shocking news that Phabius was urgently rushed to the hospital with complaints of intense headaches. She was diagnosed with an aggressive brain tumor, requiring immediate surgery and now chemotherapy and radiation.

Michele and Ivan and the MCM family have beautifully cared for Phabius thru this health crisis. We have learned about the obstacles of health care in Uganda and are continually reminded of the privileges our family has in the US. During these last few months, one of our sons injured his knee, requiring surgery, ACL reconstruction. And through his surgery and recovery, Phabius was concerned and praying for our son, Jon. Amazing and humbling!

Please join us in praying for Phabius, and the 2 additional boys facing medical challenges. We have seen how Michele and Ivan have gone to great depths to care for Phabius and all her specific needs during her treatment. They truly treat these children as if they were their own.
