


NAOMI NATUMANYA







UPDATES FROM IVAN IN UGANDA: Mpeirwe Ivan, MCM Executive Director

Hello friends, I am thrilled yet again to update you on what is happening with MCM Uganda. There many great things the Lord has done and also a few situations that were not so pleasant. But all in all, everything has worked out for our good.

I would like to start with what has been my highlight. Three years ago when MCM started we wrote an application requesting piped water services to be extended to our premise. Due to bureaucracy and corruption we have been unable to get the service. However, God made a way for us when we met this godly man who spoke wisdom to them and agreed to let us access the water without bribing. As I write this, channels are being dug to lay the pipes to bring the water to our doorstep. Drilling of the borehole was a monumental achievement and it has helped us and the community so much. But for us who live on top of the mountain and had to carry jerry cans of water uphill, it is an exciting project. The Poultry Project also takes up a lot of water and it will be a huge relief for the man who has been doing this since April.

We did a lot of farming this year and we got a good harvest. We started off by planting sorghum and then potatoes. While the sorghum didn't yield as much we would have liked, it was still a good harvest. Unfortunately, after harvesting and storing the sorghum, the place where we stored it was broken into and all 10 bags were stolen. As disappointing as that was we will not let that keep us from planting next season. The potatoes, however, exceeded our expectations as we almost ran out of room for storage! We were able to sell the potatoes harvest and realized a profit six times the amount we invested during the planting. We praise God for his provision with this. We are especially grateful to our "Auntie Kate" a widow with 4 children on the MCM program who has been the farmer managing all of our crops! She has made a wonderful addition to our team!



The piggery and chicken projects are also progressing well. The first pigs we got when we were beginning are well grown now and ready for sale. We are going to sell them as soon as we are ready. Also one gave birth to seven piglets! We will retain three of them because they are a wonderful breed and then give the others to some of our older kids as a way to start a cash generating project. We want to train our children how to do animal farming for economic gains at their young ages so they can gain experience.

The chickens too are now ready for sale and we are in the process of looking for a buyer for the roosters. We want to hold on to the hens so that they may lay eggs. It being our first time in the chicken business, there were many lessons to learn. Specifically we learned that the cost of raising roosters is higher than their revenue potential. That said, I hope once the 180 hens start laying we will be able to make up for our loss given eggs are on high demand and expensive.

Our children are very well. They continue to study hard at school and we have seen major differences in their performances ever since they joined our program. This year we hope to graduate two at the ordinary level and one at the advanced

level! Without your help, there is no way these children would have gotten this far. This August we enrolled our first college student, Obed. He performed so well! Being the oldest of all our children, the others below him have a good example to look to. Obed is currently pursuing a degree in social work and administration. I especially thank God for him because he is boy who is willing to learn. Pastor Sam and I have been slowly mentoring him and he has shown a great desire to serve God by also reaching out to those below him and helping them by tutoring them, leading them and helping them too. We thank God and his sponsor Stella who has provided the tuition costs as college education is very expensive.

We still have our monthly bible studies and I am happy to report that Pastor Sam has done a remarkable job with our teenagers. Their behavior is significantly better; they read and memorize scripture and surprise us with reciting it, something we didn't imagine would happen this fast. However, we still have some children who need extra help and we are giving more time and effort to helping them as much as possible. Our Annual Birthday Party in September was attended by all 70 of our MCM kids plus 80 additional village boys and girls, total 150 kids! Dinner, cake, soda,

When we asked why, he said it was the difference he has seen in our children. The dedication and enthusiasm they show in coming to learn God's Word, their change in behavior, the way we pour into them by doing what their guardians couldn't do, was something he was not getting where he was and wanted to be part of this. It was uplifting to listen to this teenager talk and I felt that God is in this place indeed and it gave us, as the leaders of MCM, more morale to continue with greater resolve because there is a change in our children' lives. I would like to thank you all who have made this to be possible.


