Sarah Pendo (her African name, Pendo, means "Love") was MCM's 4th child to be sponsored in June of 2013 by Julie Hess. Her mum had died of malaria, she lived with her widowed father and was in primary school at fi 14. Sarah was a good student, bright, serious and hard working.

she lived with her widowed father and was in primary school at the age of 14. Sarah was a good student, bright, serious and hard working. She did well in High School and in Advanced Level and was accepted at Bishop Stuart University in 2020. Her sponsor Julie, visited Uganda and met Sarah in 2016. Julie bought her a laptop for University and gave Sarah much confidence, encouraging her belief Sarah could do anything she wanted. Sarah, like the rest of our Ugandan children, was sidelined by COVID in 2020 when her University closed 6 weeks after she began. After taking virtual classes on and off in 2021, finally in 2022 Sarah was able to return to campus.

The following are quotes from letters Julie has received from Sarah so you too can marvel at the growth of this precious young lady.

# November 2020

"I thank God for all He has continued to do in my life. I see miracles happening everyday and I have started wondering who I am! I want to pursue Social Work so as to change the lives of my fellow girls to become influential women in the future. I hope I will make it because I CAN and I have already started the struggle...I continue to emphasize the greatest commandment which is Love. Love holds everything together and one gains nothing from hating. If all people on earth had true love the world would have been a beautiful place to live."



#### August 2021

"I am still looking forward to restoring hope into people's lives, especially those who have disappointments and failures. I pray that God can give the capacity and the right words and encouragement to always give them. Failure is not an ending, rather a road to success."

## May 2022

"I am currently working (part time) as a waitress...not only am I earning (money) but am also getting some life experiences on different characters which is important in my career as a Social Worker. People are very different you know! There are certain people with behaviors that are unbearable but when you get used to their way of life it becomes normal strengthen relationship. I am enjoying studying Social Work because it encourages social change, though social change is difficult in our country, Uganda, but what I know one day we will achieve it."

## August 2022

"My main objective will be identifying the most common offenses and how they are handled by the people in charge. Our people here in Uganda are facing a problem of being ignored by police and the law enforcers most especially because of bribery. The issues of the poor are left unattended to because the rich bribe the police to close their files. I became so much concerned about this issue mostly seeing it on social media platforms which arose my curiosity and anxiety to go into the field to find out if it is true. After my internship (at a local Police Department) I will find out the real truth and I will make some real change at least in advocating for the poor in one way or another."

During her internship this September Sarah herself became a crime victim. Although MCM and her sponsors moved quickly to ensure justice was served, ironically, all of Sarah's file was inexplicably lost, evidence was ruined and the man identified as her perpetrator was set free... an obvious case of police bribery. Yet, our Sarah stands strong today and continues on to her final year of University. Her goal remains to right the wrongs she identified even before she experienced this pain personally. We are so grateful to have had the



privilege of sharing in Sarah's life these ten years. We have watched her grow into her name, Sarah Pendo = Love. Love never fails. And Love has not failed 350 plus lives these past ten years, including mine! Amazing! Thank you so much for ten years of changing lives!

# **UPDATES FROM IVAN IN UGANDA: DECEMBER 2022**

Greetings in the name of Jesus and a Happy Christmas! We have great reason to celebrate God's faithfulness at this time. In January 2023 MCM will celebrate our Ten Year Anniversary! Ten years ago we started with sponsors for three young students. It felt so rewarding to offer hope and change to these orphaned children! Ten years later, two are graduated, helping their families financially and with the skills they attained. The third continues to progress in school.

After ten years MCM currently helps over 310 children! Counting all the children who have completed the program the number is bigger still...360! God has really been good and the testimonies we have are endless. Like **Ivan** who graduated with a certificate in Electrical Engineering and Electronics. He was taken by a company in the capital city of Kampala and does very well there because of his good work. There is Obed, who was



'booked' before he graduated university because of his aptitude in Social Work. It is almost unheard of in Uganda for an organization to go hunting for an employee even before they graduate. Annabella, too, is doing outstanding, carrying on her teaching skills so well she was recruited from her first teaching job by an even better school in another part of Uganda.

Attending University and Vocational schools, at this writing, MCM is grateful to support five Nursing students, one Midwife student, two Clinical Medicine students and one Medical Records student. Our hospitals have struggled

with having few quality medical professionals. We are honored that as an organization MCM is going to make a contribution to health care when these nine students complete next year. Praising God many future infants and delivering mothers will survive while other preventable deaths will reduce with more well trained Ugandan hospital staff.

In addition to the medical field we support three Social Work students, two Education students, a future Accountant and another in I.T. We are also proud of our students studying to be Carpenters, Tailors, Knitters, Automotive Repair workers, Tourism leaders, Hair Dressers, **Civil Engineers and** Environmental workers. We praise God! Without His blessings and your support these young people would have remained uneducated; financially unable to develop their gifts, skills and talents. Our village is also blessed with every child

that graduates because I have seen some we started ten years ago come back and help other children. Like Owen, another Electrician who has installed over 40 solar units in our MCM children's guardians' homes. Or Blessing who volunteers to help younger students write their letters! It is becoming a cycle and it is amazing to see.

Next year, we will likely have seven more joining university and eight joining vocational school. Tuition multiplies seven fold for these students who move from secondary school to university. Those that join vocational institutes, the number increases five fold depending on the course they pursue. Courses in the medical field increase ten


## EMMANUEL T.

Ashavin (6) in Kindergarten and wants to be a "Driver". His father was killed by a speeding car in 2018. His Mum, Mackline is a farmer and takes care of the children but struggles since they have no property to farm and just looks for manual labor from place to place.

Mark (15, brothers with Kennedy, below) is in grade seven. Mark wants to be a doctor. His mother died in 2014 from a neck tumor. His father suffered a stroke in 2020 and cannot speak or move. ## **RUTH ABENAWE**

Ruth (7) is in Nursery school for the first time. She does not know what she wants to be when she grows up. Her Mum, Editor, has Schizophrenia and is a single mother as she was abused. Editor leaves home during schizophrenic episodes and disappears leaving Ruth locked in the house with no food. Relatives have intervened and removed her from the home.



#### KENNEDY TWINOMUCUNGUZI


